



#### **Arbor Education**

As you are aware, St. Mary's is proud to be part of Bishop Wilkinson Catholic Education Trust. Following a recent, significant, contract change imposed by one of our current contractors, a working party, which included primary representation, was established to identify what a new, 'fit for purpose' Management Information System (MIS) would look like. A robust tender process was undertaken, and Arbor Education was awarded the contract to be our new MIS provider, from 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023.

The MIS is a computer system which is used to hold and manage your child's school records. These records include their contact details, next of kin, attendance, educational and medical information. All schools have a statutory obligation to hold and manage this information. A letter with a parental contact information form has been given to your child today.

The form for each child at St Mary's must be checked and returned to the school office by Friday 24th March. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

# **World Down Syndrome Day**
