We have had a busy week in school as classes prepare for their Easter Fair stalls and create their bonnets in readiness for the Easter Bonnet Parade next Wednesday. Parents attending the Easter Bonnet parade will be welcomed into the hall from 9.10am via the Fire Exit doors. The children will then make their bonnet debut. Class teachers will take a photograph of each child wearing their bonnet and will send this home with your child later next week.

Easter Fair Donations
