#### **Revised Timings of School Day**

In March 2022, the Department for Education set out the government's expectation that all schools should deliver a minimum school week of 32.5 hours by September 2023.

Our school, along with a number of other schools in the local area and across the Trust, is making some minor changes to the school week to comply with this expectation.

#### September 2023:

- Start of school day **8.45am** (Gates open at **8.40am**)
- End of school day 3.15pm

From September we are introducing a 'Soft Start' to the school day. As such, key staff will be outside from the earlier time of 8.40am. All children will enter school via the main entrance (and not line up on the yard) from 8.40am onwards. Class teachers will remain in their classrooms and will greet the children at the classroom door. This will ensure a calm start to the school day, ensuring that learning can start promptly from 8.45am when the school day starts.

#### **Inhalers**

Children with inhalers will bring their school inhaler home today. Please can any children requiring an inhaler bring a spare one (to remain in school) when school starts again in September.

#### **Wild Passport**

In September, pupils in years 1-4 will take part in WILD Passport once a week. Wild passport is an outdoor learning curriculum with fully realized progressive skills. The WILD Passport provides children with weekly outdoor learning opportunities, taught by outdoor education experts. As such, we advise that children in years 1-4 have a pair of wellingtons and/or some sturdy walking boots and a waterproof coat in preparation for this. The sessions are due to take place each Tuesday.

#### **Hexham Abbey-A Peaceful World-Singing project**

We are sending out a leaflet to accompany this week's newsletter promoting Hexham Abbey's Festival due to take place in September. We would particularly like to draw your attention to the 'Joint Schools Project' being held in Hexham Abbey on **September 21st**. Fiona Lander is leading this year's festival singing project with young people from local schools, including St. Mary's KS2 children, to mark United Nations World Peace Day.

The event will take place between 10.30am and midday with parents and the general public are invited to attend the performances. Entry will be free.
