Reception Curriculum Workshops

Reception's curriculum workshops will take place on:

The workshops will begin at the <u>earlier</u> time of 3:00pm, before your child is collected from school. Whilst parents and carers attend the curriculum workshops, the children will be supervised by another adult in the school hall.

We appreciate your involvement in your children's education and by attending these workshops you will gain an understanding of how you can better support your child at home.

All Creatures Great & Small

As a school we are taking part in an exhibition held at St. Mary's Catholic Church called 'All Creatures Great & Small'. During the weekend of the 13th-15th October an exhibition of work produced by parishioners, children, staff (and anyone who wants to!) will be displayed at the Church, all about animals. In school, the children have been given the opportunity to create some work for the exhibition based on any animal that is/has been special to them or someone they know and/or a funny story about an animal etc. If children would like to bring any photos of their pets to go alongside this work, they are welcome to. On Sunday the 15th October (time TBC) Fr. Jeff will be holding a short service outside of St. Mary's Church where families are invited to bring along their precious pets for a special blessing. All families, friends and pets of St. Mary's are invited to attend this event.

Homework & Reading Books

From last **Friday 15th September** children were sent home a reading book, their Reading Record and their first piece of homework. Children in Reception and Y1 take home a RWInc home reading book. Children in Y2, Y3 and Y4 take home a library book which matches their Accelerated Reader level. Children in Y2, Y3 and Y4 who take part in a phonics intervention also take home a RWInc home reading book and a library book. The expectation is that children read at least 1 book a week and when completed parents/carers write a note in their child's Reading Record and sign to say their child has finished their reading book. When the child returns their signed Reading Record and book to school, they will be given the opportunity to visit the library to exchange their library books. The children will be given new books each Wednesday, however, if they finish their book and have their Reading Record signed it can be changed as and when is required.

First Reconciliation & Holy Communion Preparation 2023-24 for St Mary's Y4 pupils

Following the summer break, our parish community at Saint Mary's will begin to prepare children for First Reconciliation (Confession) and First Holy Communion. This programme of preparation is open to all baptised Catholic children in Year Four and above.
