

### Communication and Language

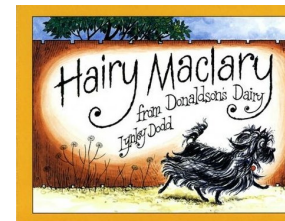
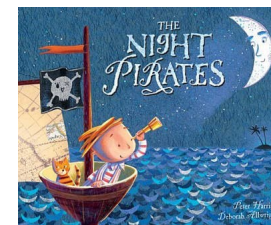
- The children will have access to a pirate ship role-play area where they can act out the story of 'The Night Pirates'.
- The children will take part in singing a range of pirate themed songs, one of which will be to the tune of wind the bobbin up.
- The children will have access to a vets surgery which will be set up in the role-play area.

### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- The children will take part in a pirate treasure hunt, listening carefully to the clues and working as a team to find the treasure.
- Children bring in pictures of their own pets from home to share with their peers during a circle time activity.

### Cultural Capital and Memorable Experiences

- The children will make their own pirate ships using junk modelling and investigate if their ship sinks or floats in the water tray.
- Invite a local vet to come into school to talk about their job role.



### Physical Development

- Children design and create their own pirate hat, using a range of small tools.
- The children will cut and stick pictures, showing how to look after a dog.
- The children will set up an obstacle course for their peers to complete in role as different animals.

### Mathematics

- The children investigate a range of different coins, adding together two single digit amounts and putting the correct amount of money in the treasure chest.
- The children will create their own symmetrical flags for their pirate ship.
- The children will order pictures of different dogs based upon their sizes.

### Understanding the World

- The children will investigate which of the pirates objects float and which of them sink.
- The children will learn about different breeds of dogs and their specific needs, developing an understanding of how to look after and care for them.

### Expressive Arts and Design

- The sand tray will be set up with strings attached horizontally and vertically to create a grid. The children will dig for treasure and record on a map with a grid which square they found the treasure in.
- The children will also mark on copies of the map where they have buried treasure and other children will hunt for it.
- The children will create dog masks out of paper plates, creating their own breed of dog with a range of different materials.

### Literacy

- The children write letters to the night pirates, explaining why they'd be good at being a pirate.
- The children label a picture of a cat to outline it's features.
- The children locate the rhyming words in the story Hairy Maclary.

**Communication and Language**

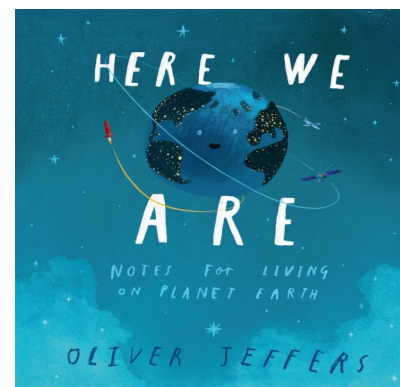
- The children will be visited from emergency service workers who will explain how they help people in our local community. The children will devise their own questions to ask them.

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development**

- The children will draw a family tree which can be shared with their peers. We will discuss how each family is different but how they are all as important.
- During circle time activities the children will discuss what job role they would like as an adult and how they will help the world in which we live.

**Cultural Capital and Memorable Experiences**

- The children will investigate the planets in our solar system. The children will work together and use paper Mache to create our own class solar-system.



**Physical Development**

- The children will draw and paint pictures of their families and animals using a variety of small tools.
- The children will join in with the song 'I jumped aboard my rocket ship', joining in with space related actions.

**Mathematics**

- The children will measure their own and their peer's height using non-standard units. They will compare who is the tallest and who is the shortest.

**Understanding the World**

- Children create a life-sized skeleton, learning where specific bones and key organs are placed. The children will learn the names of these bones and organs and be able to label these.
- The children will investigate and create their own constellations, using black card and white paint.

**Expressive Arts and Design**

- The children will investigate the planets in our solar system and create their own representations of these using a range of different mediums.
- Sea animals bubble wrap printing.

**Literacy**

- The children will create a poster explaining how to keep healthy and safe. They will include illustrations on their poster.
